IOM HAITI in 2011—Quantitative Accomplishments

60 Vigilance committees in camps and surroundings neighborhoods equipped and trained on **Disaster Risk Reduction and Management**;

27 Evacuation shelters built or rehabilitated by our **Disaster Risk Management Program**;

10,497 **Transitional Shelter** units built;

20,700 IDPs (3,174 families) relocated to **planned camps** and with better conditions;

13,650 IDPs (4,823 IDP families) supported in their **return from camps to communities** of origin;

1,190 Latrines built in camps and **return neighborhoods**;

330 Hand washing stations installed in camps as part of the **cholera response**.

116,702 IDPs in 48 priority camps targeted by community **health education** sessions and campaigns;

6,867 Staff in Government of Haiti, NGO, camp committee, UN Police and UN, trained on **camp management**;

841 Trainings on **protection and SGBV** conducted to camps population, focusing on the youth;

53,004 Cubic meters of **rubble removed**;

46,866,289 **Non-Food Items** distributed;

4,919 Haitians returnees provided with **return and reintegration assistance**;

894 **Trafficked children** reunified with their families, all with a follow-up ensured by IOM staff.
